Surgical Excellence

As the population in the Hill Country grows at a rapid pace, so too does the need for high quality surgical care close to home. Currently, the two operating rooms at Baylor Scott & White Medical Center - Marble Falls are



functioning at 90% capacity, with physicians conducting more than 200 surgeries per month. In response to this growing need, a third operating room will be constructed in a shell space already present at Baylor Scott & White -Marble Falls. This will enable us to serve both existing and new patients as our community continues to grow.

Women's Health & Imaging Services

The Women's Health & Imaging Services team continues to see an increase in patients at Baylor Scott & White - Marble Falls. A refresh is planned for the clinic in 2021; including, updates to paint colors, new art work, aromatherapy, and warm robes to provide a spa-like experience for patients undergoing procedures. The goal is to utilize advanced imaging technologies, in combination with physician expertise in interpretation and diagnosis, to provide quality care to patients in a comfortable and nurturing environment.

While 2020 was a difficult year in many ways, the unfailing support of Communities Connected was sufficient enough to finance ALL the priority initiatives submitted by our departments. With many of our resources focused on the ongoing pandemic, several of the following needs would have gone unfunded this year without your support:



Baylor Scott & White Medical Center - Marble Falls

- Walkers (15) and Pulse Oximeters (20) to support indigent patients throughout their at-home recovery and help prevent readmissions.
- > Orthopedic Recliners (5+) with increased space underneath to allow for use of assistive equipment to enhance the safety of the care provider and reduce patient falls.
- Vein Finder is more patient-friendly by using infrared detection to assist in the placement of an IV or central line.
- Wall-Mount Manual Blood Pressure Cuffs give providers the ability to double check a patient's blood pressure when automated devices identify unusual levels.
- Smoke Evacuator Units enable safe evacuation of smoke particles to reduce the risk of infection during dermatological procedures.
- Small Box Filing Cabinet for specimen storage to improve patient care flow and processes.



Baylor Scott & White Clinics

- Transcutaneous Bilirubin Meter added in Kingsland to allow monitoring of newborn bilirubin levels and limit the need for blood draws.
- Upgrades to current front entrance ramp in Johnson City to allow for wheelchair storage and more room to open clinic doors.
- Walkers (33) for unsteady patients to use while in the clinic to reduce risk of falls and potential injury.
